



Grants Offered for Truck Replacement

Caltrans, ACTA program aimed at improving air quality

As many as 15 \$25,000 grants will be awarded to replace trucks servicing the ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles thanks to a new program from Caltrans and the Alameda Corridor Transportation Authority.



The grants, to be distributed under Caltrans and ACTA's Heim Bridge Replacement Mitigation Truck Program, are part of an effort to improve air quality.

Eligible vehicles must be registered and operating, on-road, Class 8, heavy-duty, California Air Resources Board-exempt trucks servicing the ports.

The online application opens Tuesday, April 15.

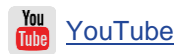

Caltrans and ACTA are replacing the Heim Bridge, which does not meet current earthquake standards, with a fixed-span bridge over the Cerritos Channel. They will also construct a new, four-lane elevated expressway that will allow cars and trucks to move from Terminal Island directly onto Alameda Street.
