Health Education and outreach was extremely well received by the community, staff and patients. The home visit and chronic disease management components were slightly more challenging to achieve due to attrition. Our staff had increased confirmation, and attendance to the first visits, or classes but participants did not complete the entire series. Child activities were not widely implemented as participants made childcare arrangements for their children. TCC was also able to purchase Spirometry testing equipment for 5 Clinics in the grant catchment area. The purchase of computers for staff is included in the next round of funding.</p> <p>The attached table illustrates our performance with each of the grant deliverables.</p>
